This is a Cirrus cloud: they're high ice clouds that look like wispy curls




This is a Cirrocumulus cloud: These clouds often signal unsettled weather.



This is a Cirrostratus Cloud: Sometimes these clouds make a halo effect around the sun when you see this it means rain is approaching



This is an Altocumulus Cloud: It is a thin sheet of white or grey cloud broken into blobs, rolls, waves or bands.



This is an Altostratus Cloud: Its a thin layer of grey cloud through which sunlight is visible, if the cloud thickens it may rain.



This is a Nimbostratus Cloud: It's a thick grey cloud they make rain and snow.



This is a Stratocumulus Cloud: it's a low cloud broken into rolls or patches it's usually in a regular pattern.



This is a Stratus Cloud: it's a low grey cloud that often produces light rain and drizzle.



This is a Cumulus Cloud: this is a fluffy cloud with a flat base, these are often seen on sunny days.



This is a Cumulonimbus Cloud: These clouds often indicate a thunderstorm is on the way!
